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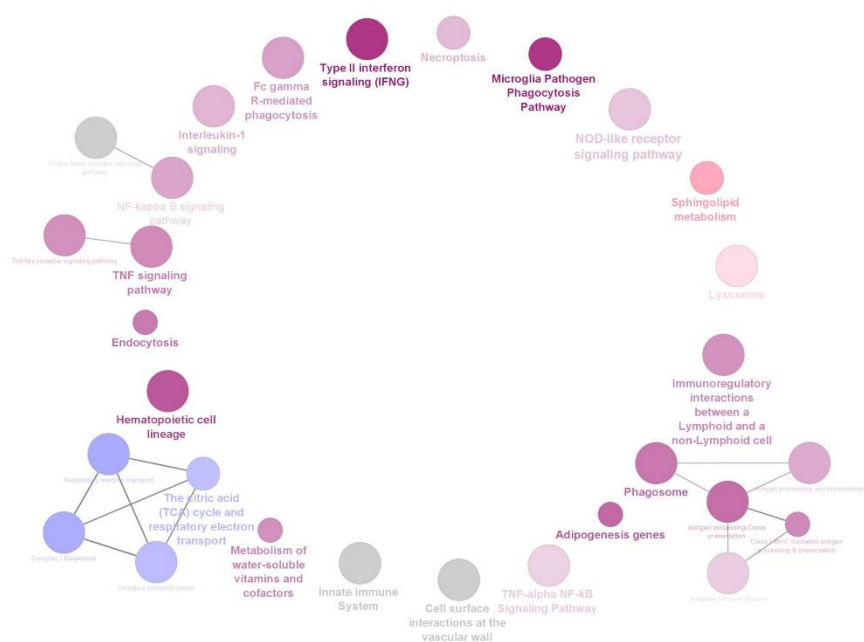

The functional grouping of regulated proteins in activated macrophages confirms similarities (violet) and highlights differences between the bacterial strains PA57 (blue) and MSSA60 (red)
