Online Resource 3. Herbarium specimens of *Luzula alpina* (A), *L. multiflora* (B) and mountain forms of *L. exspectata* (C) showing high similarity in general habit and inflorescence characters. In (A) variation in width of the basal leaves of *L. alpina* is indicated, in (B) variously congested inflorescences of alpine tetraploid *L. multiflora* are shown (those in the left resemble *L. alpina*), and in (C) variation in inflorescence congestion in *L. exspectata* is illustrated. The identification of all plants shown was karyologically confirmed.
