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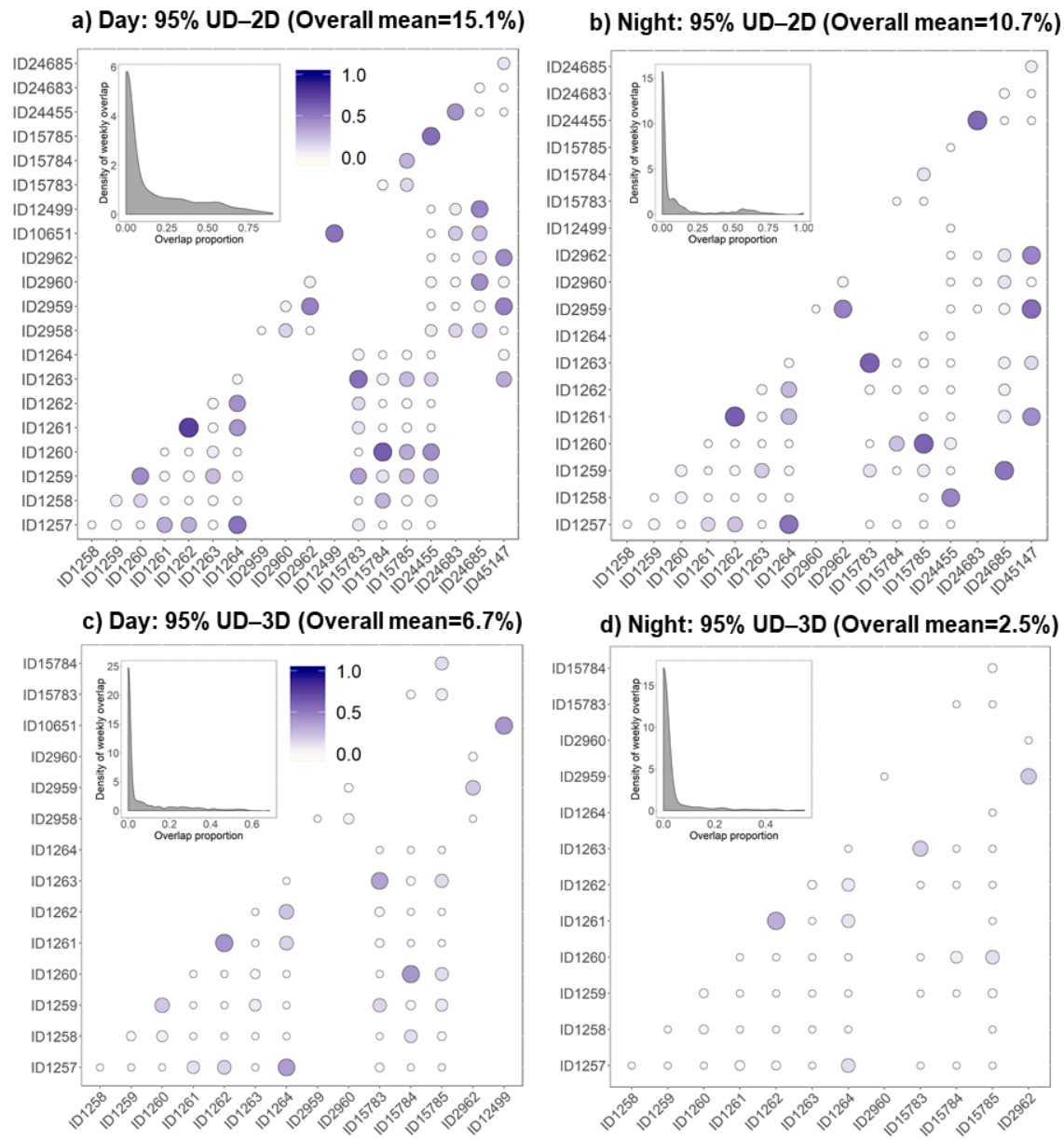
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Supplementary Figure 1: Access to interactive 3D hawksbill sea turtle activity spaces. Download the following files (and keep them saved in the same folder):

Supplementary Figure 2: Mean weekly day and night 2D (a, b) and 3D (c, d) overlap among individuals based on weekly periods of co-occurrence in the study area. Empty cells for individual pairings indicate that both individuals did not co-occur during the study period. Upper left subplots indicate the distribution of weekly overlap values among individuals.
