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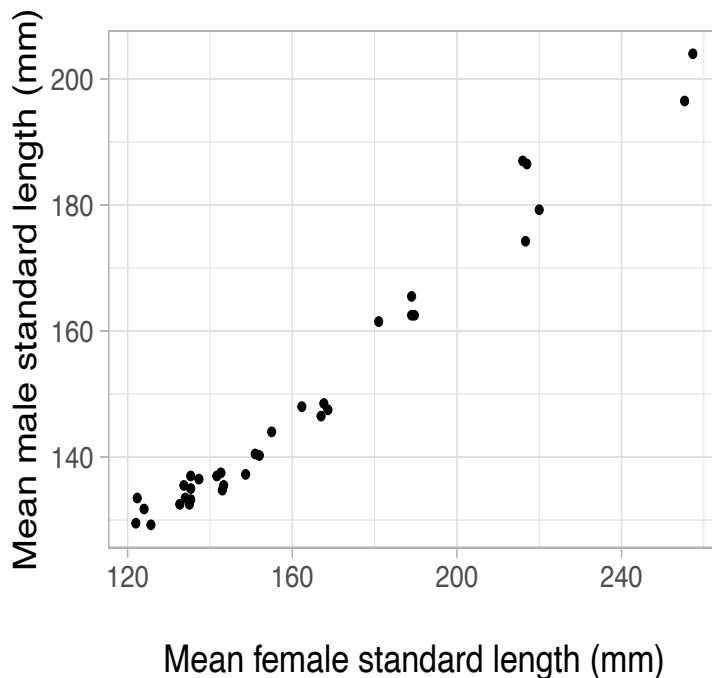
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Supplementary Fig. S1 Mean male and female standard lengths

Male and female body lengths were matched within replicates, as shown in this figure. The panel shows the mean standard length of males and females for each replicate. The female trios were always bigger than their matched males.
