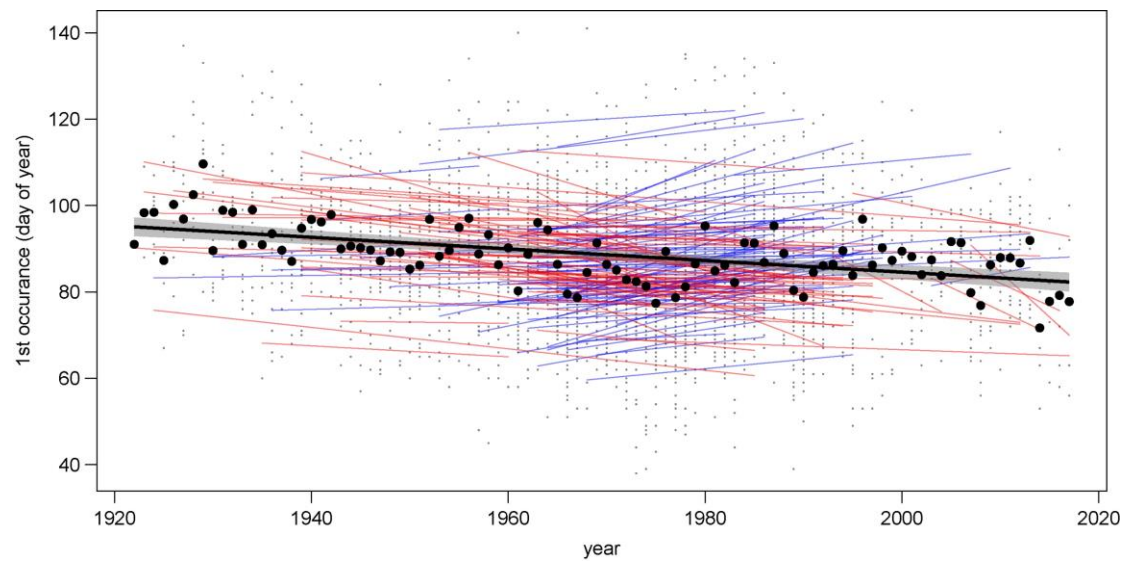


Figure S1. Site-specific trends of changes in spring arrival time of the Common Starling *Sturnus vulgaris* between 1922–2017 from 171 locations across Northeast Europe. Black dots – mean arrival date of each year. Black line represents the overall trend and shaded area designates 95% confidence interval. Grey dots – annual arrival date at individual study sites. Red and blue lines – trend of changes in arrival time at each study site (red – advancing, blue – delaying).
