

Examples of WD2 Workforce Identities

States/Tribes/Territories

WD2: Mental Health & Related Workforce trained in mental health/related practices

TR1: Measures the total number of participants trained. Technically, mental health and related workforce are captured in both WD2 and TR1.

On the left side of the column are examples of WD2 workforce identities. On the right side are examples of workforce identities that *are not* WD2. This list is not an exhaustive list for either WD2 or TR1.
