2) a) Are some or all samples listed in the excel sheet we provided you – containing the original passport data of the samples that were sent to your genebank as part of the network of base collections – still conserved in your genebank?

b) Can you provide in the table below the numbers of samples which you received and still conserve from IBPGR for each of the crops, and the total number of accessions you conserve of the respective crop.

These data should include country of origin, collecting number, collecting date, site description and/or coordinates, along with other passport data.

6) Do you conserve additional samples that your genebank received from IBPGR, but which are not included in the list we sent you? If yes, can you briefly state, how many and for which crops?
