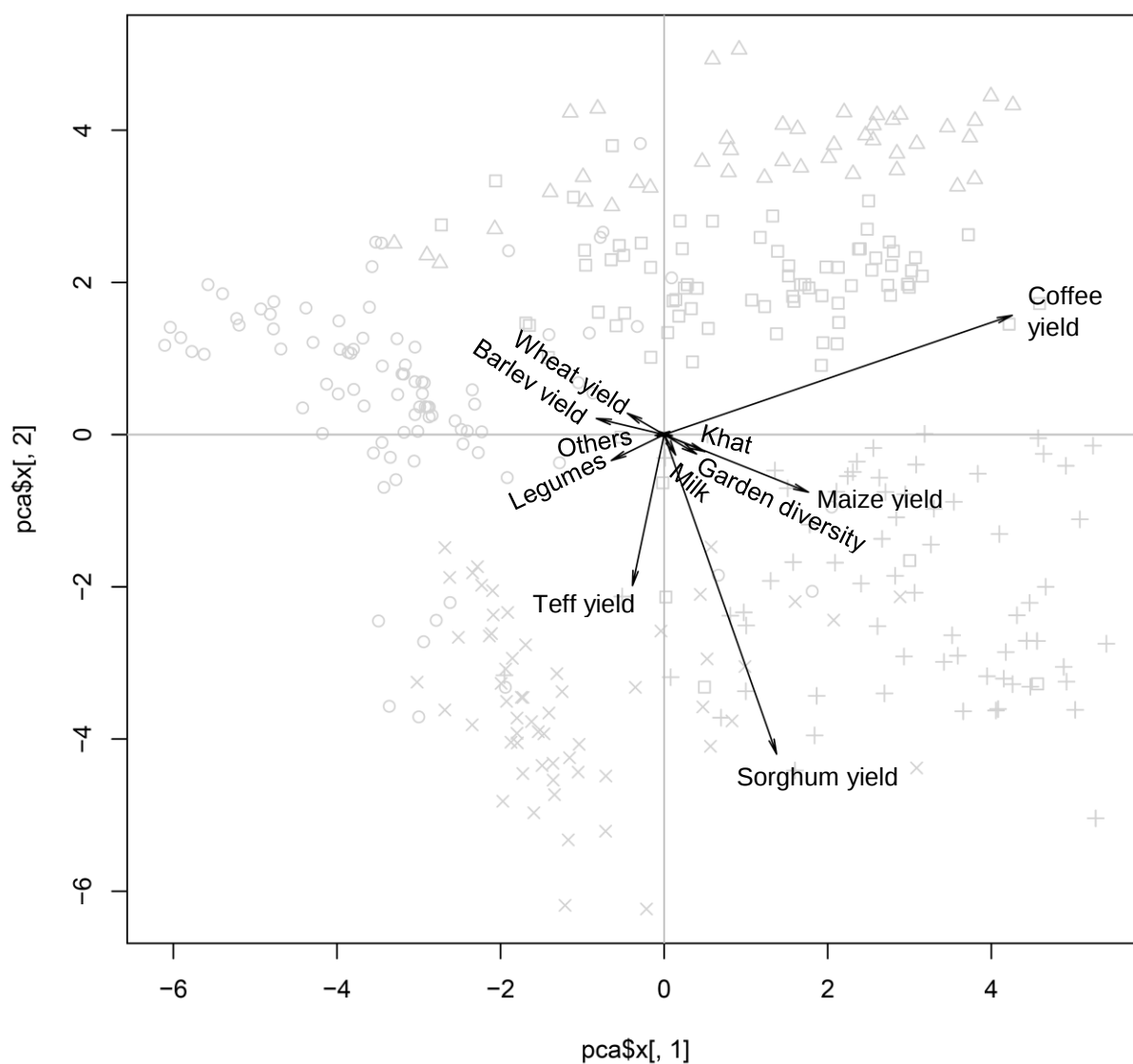

Online Resource 6 PCA plot of livelihood activities. The symbols indicate the livelihood strategies that households belong to. The first and second axis of the PCA accounted for 26% and 23% of variation in the data, respectively. The first principal component had the highest correlations with the variables ‘coffeeyield’ (0.85), ‘maizeyield’ (0.35), and ‘sorghumyield’ (0.27). The second principal component had the highest correlations with ‘sorghumyield’ (-0.84), ‘teffyield’ (-0.40) and ‘coffeeyield’ (0.31).

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
