

- Tumor of the follicular infundibulum (TFI) is a rare benign neoplasm providing two distinctive clinical patterns: the solitary and the eruptive form.
- The clinical presentations resemble many other dermatologic conditions and require histopathological study in order to make a definite diagnosis.
- The eruptive form has been described as symmetrically distributed hypopigmented macules and papules with irregular or angulated borders confined to the face, neck and upper trunk.
- TFI should be considered when a patient with hypopigmented lesions, particularly on the head and neck area, does not respond to the treatment based on the clinical diagnosis.

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
