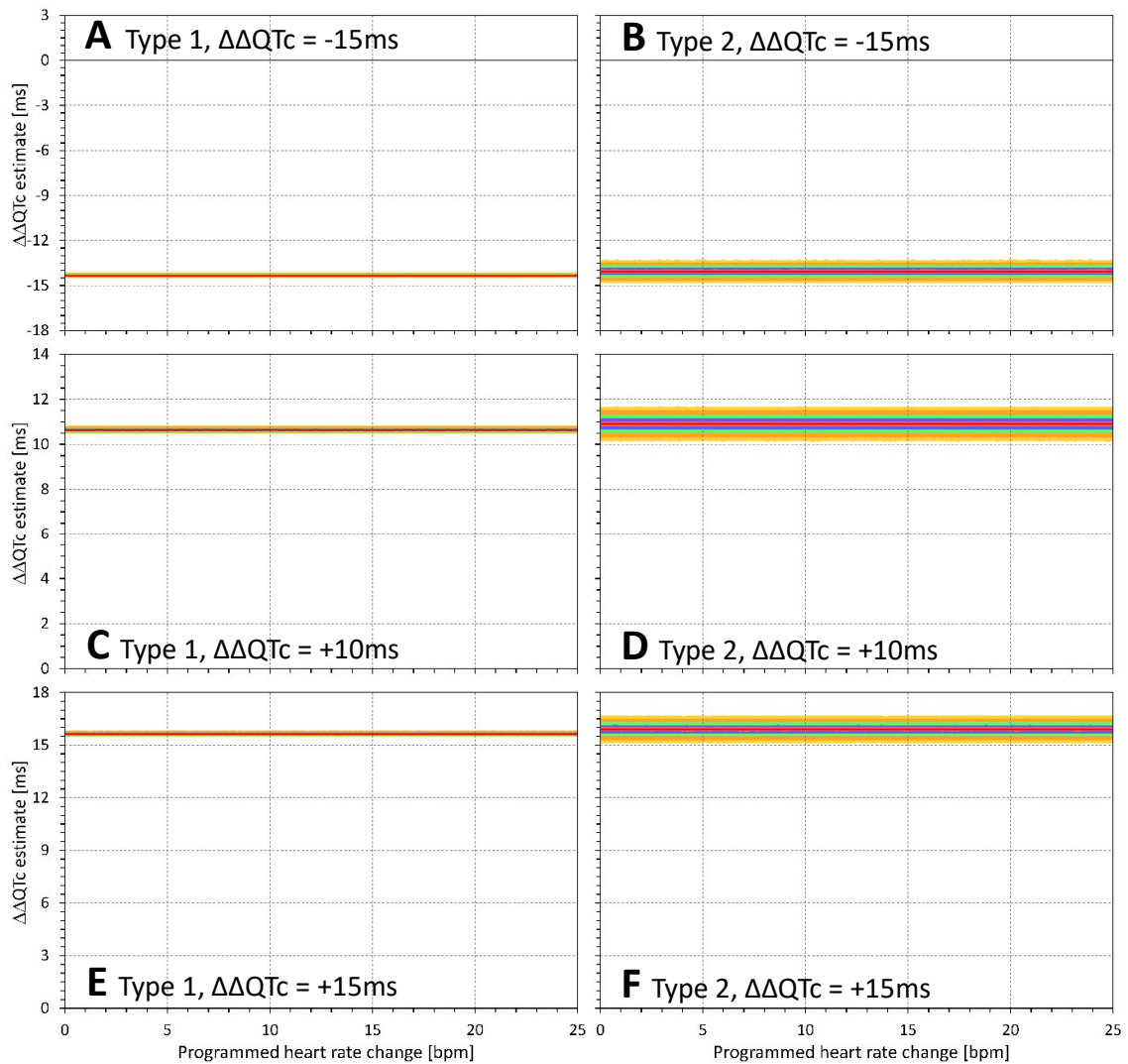

# **Full QT/RR profile subject-specific correction with no requirement of QTc vs RR correlation**



Results of the statistical modeling experiments that used curve-linear subject-specific heart rate corrections derived from the full drug-free QT/RR profile in each subject. The layout of the figure is the same as in Figure 4 of the main article. Compare with Figures 5, 6, 7, and 8 in which the heart rate corrections assured zero correlation between all QTc and RR intervals in each of the experiments.
