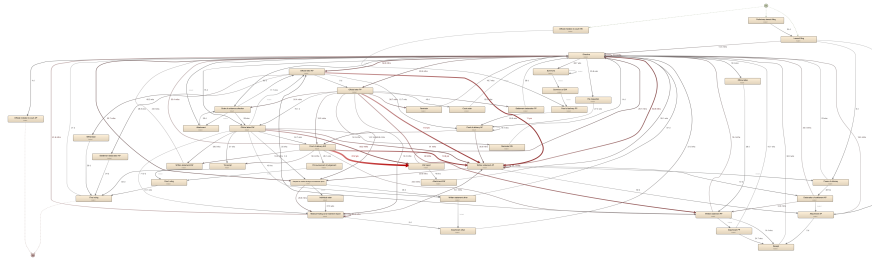


Figure A1: Process model visualizing mean duration of the log subset containing only cases involving expert witnesses.

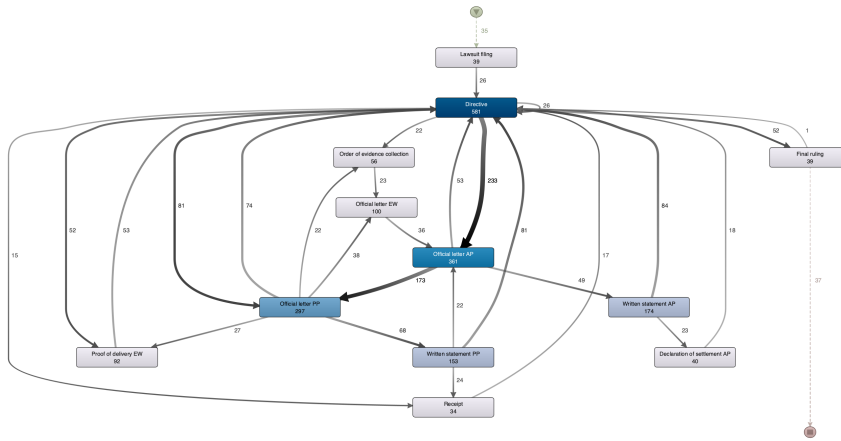


Figure A2: Process model visualizing frequencies of the log subset containing only cases not involving attorneys.

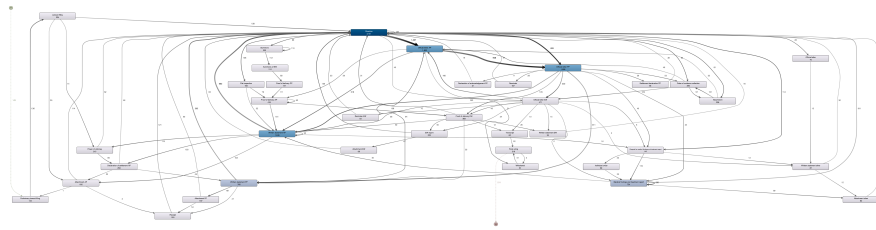


Figure A3: Process model visualizing frequencies of the log subset containing only cases involving attorneys.
