Sample size	A total of 6,672 micrographs were collected from T. denticola wild-type cells for in situ cryo-EM analysis. 379,837 particles were initially classified after 2D classification. Ultimately, the helical reconstruction map of WT sheathed flagellar filament achieved a near-atomic resolution of 3.2 Å. The asymmetric reconstruction of WT flagellar filament achieved a 3.95 Å resolution. The asymmetric reconstruction of WT non-sheathed flagellar filament achieved a 3.72 Å resolution. For in vitro dataset, a total of 4,319 micrographs were collected from T. denticola ΔflaB3 purified flagellar filaments. 643,096 particles were initially classified after 2D classification. Ultimately, the asymmetric reconstruction of ΔflaB3 sheathed flagellar filament achieved a 3.44 Å. The asymmetric reconstruction of WT non-sheathed flagellar filament achieved a 3.67 Å resolution.
Data exclusions	Cryo-EM particles with poor quality or irrelevant features were excluded during 2D and 3D classification. This standard procedure is widely used to obtain high-resolution cryo-EM structures of biomacromolecules.
