The sample size was determined based on prior power analysis and standard practices in the field. We used $n = 3$ biologically independent replicates for all key experiments, including cell transfection, rice transformation. Cell transfection and rice transformation were performed as described in the methods.

All attempts for replication were successful. For the experiments in HEK293T cells and rice protoplasts, a minimum of three independent experiments were included. For the library selection, two independent biological replicates were performed in HEK293T cells and rice protoplasts.

Seed stocks	Wild type Y88s rice seeds obtained from Jiangsu Lixiahe Region Agricultural Science Research Institute
Novel plant genotypes	Herbicide-resistant rice plants were created using a genome-editing tool comprising a prime editor and a recombinase. The endogenous target site is located upstream of the OsEPSPS gene, and the corresponding guide RNA (epegRNA) sequences are provided in Supplementary Table 1.
Authentication	Y88s seed genotype was verified by reality identification, and the edited plant phenotype was confirmed by glyphosate spray application. PCR analysis was performed to confirm the absence of randomly integrated OsEPSPS pentamutant expression cassettes.
