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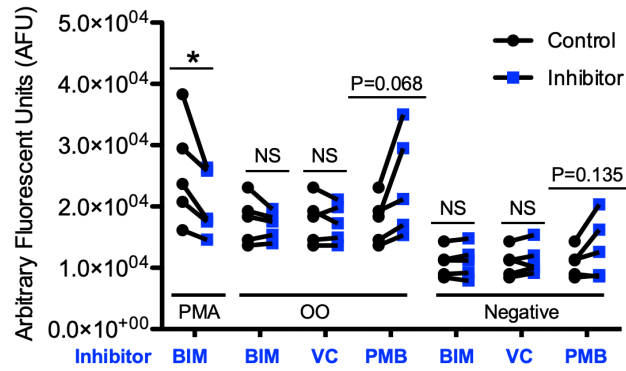
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Supplementary Figure. 1. Involvement of PKC, ROS and LPS in OO induced NETs. A. Inhibition of PKC with BIM, ROS with scavenger VC, and LPS with PMB. Data were expressed as paired comparisons of NETosis between control (black) and inhibitors (blue) of 5 cattle samples. Data were analyzed by paired Student's *t* test. BIM: Bisindolylmaleimide I. PMB: Polymyxin B. VC: vitamin C.
