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Supplementary figure legends

Supplementary Fig. S1. PGG had no effect on DSS-induced colitis in mice. Mice were orally gavaged with PGG (20 mg/kg) daily and colitis was induced with 3% DSS for 5 days ($n = 10\text{--}11$ per group). Percentages of body weight (A) and clinical scores (B) of mice were measured as described in the methods.

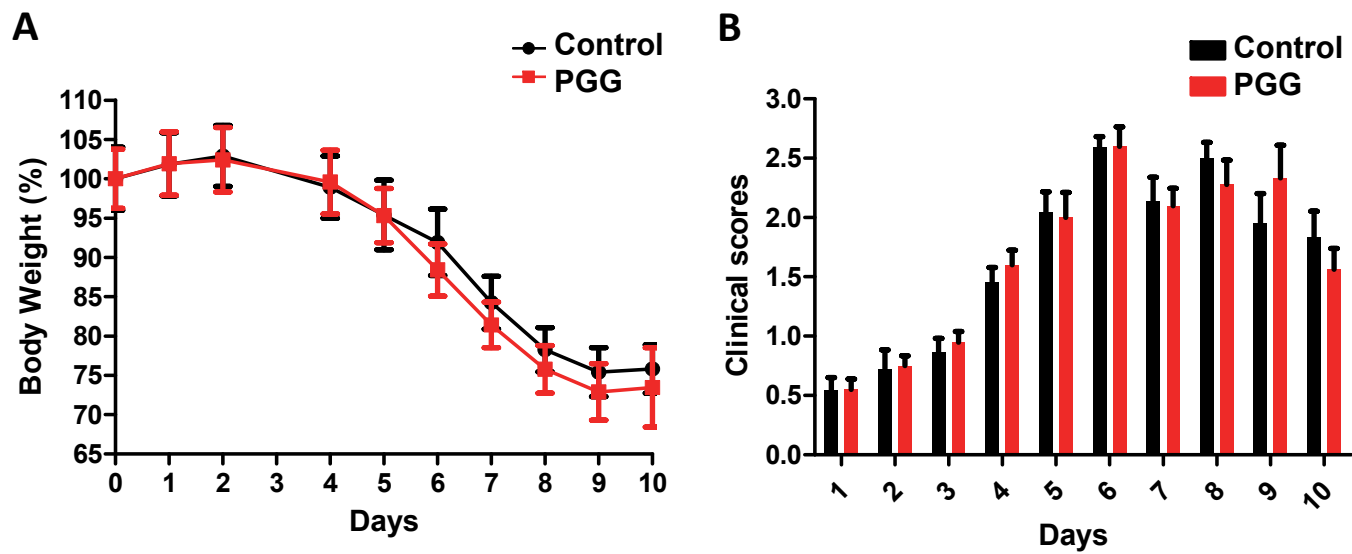
