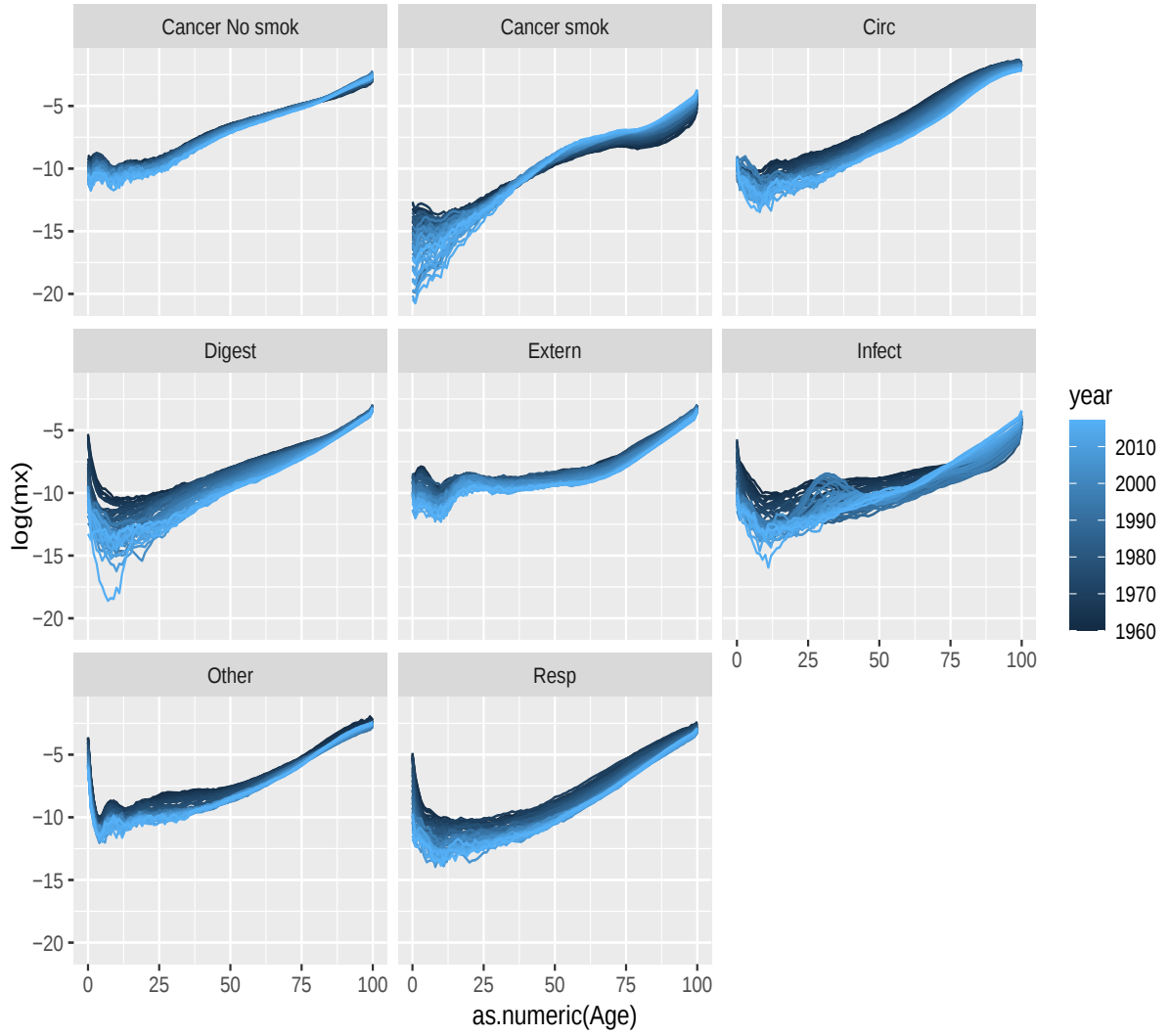


Figure A.1: Female population. Age and cause-specific death rates in log scale. Estimation using PCLM and our ICD classification.

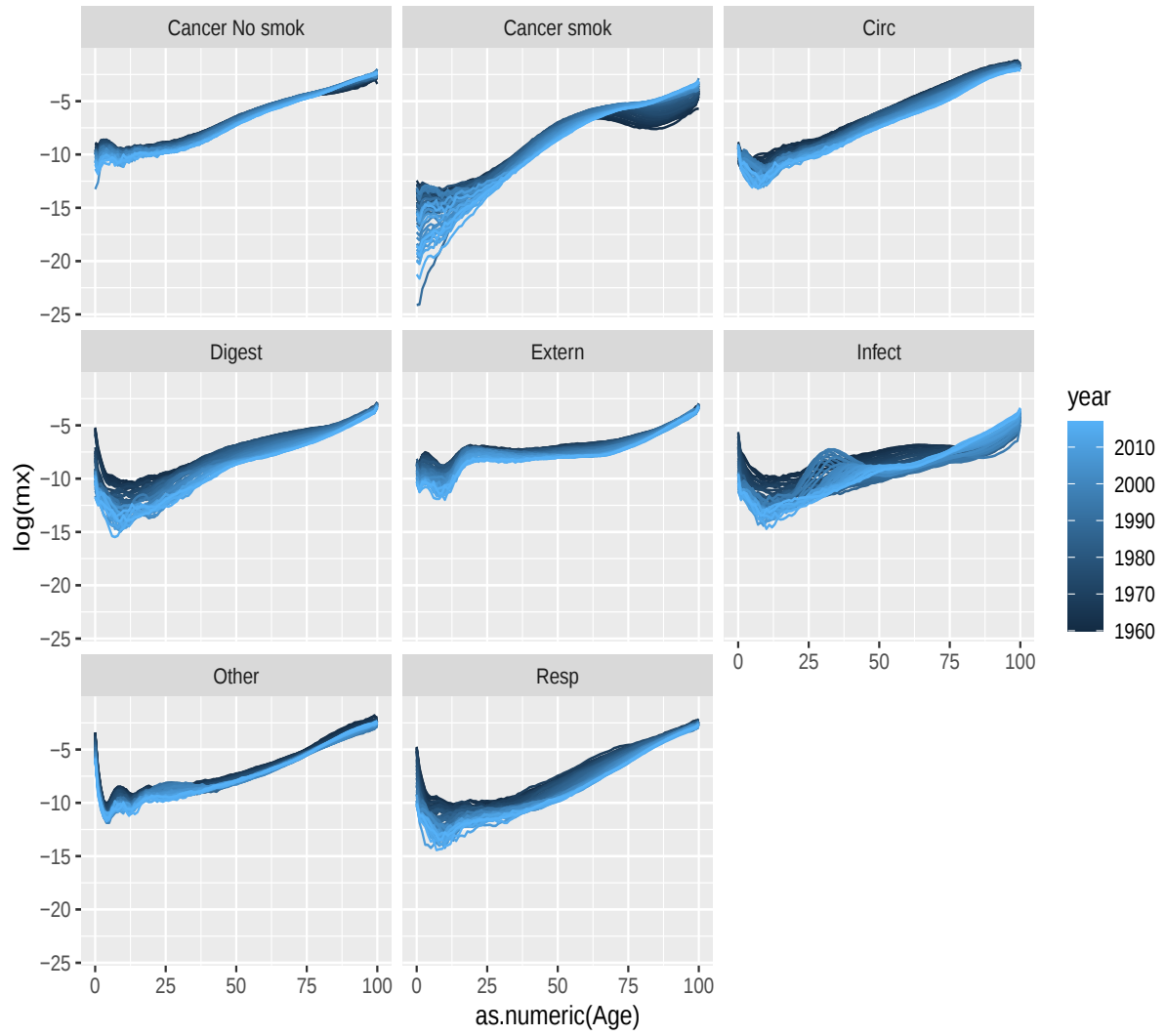


Figure A.2: Male population. Age and cause-specific death rates in log scale. Estimation using PCLM and our ICD classification.

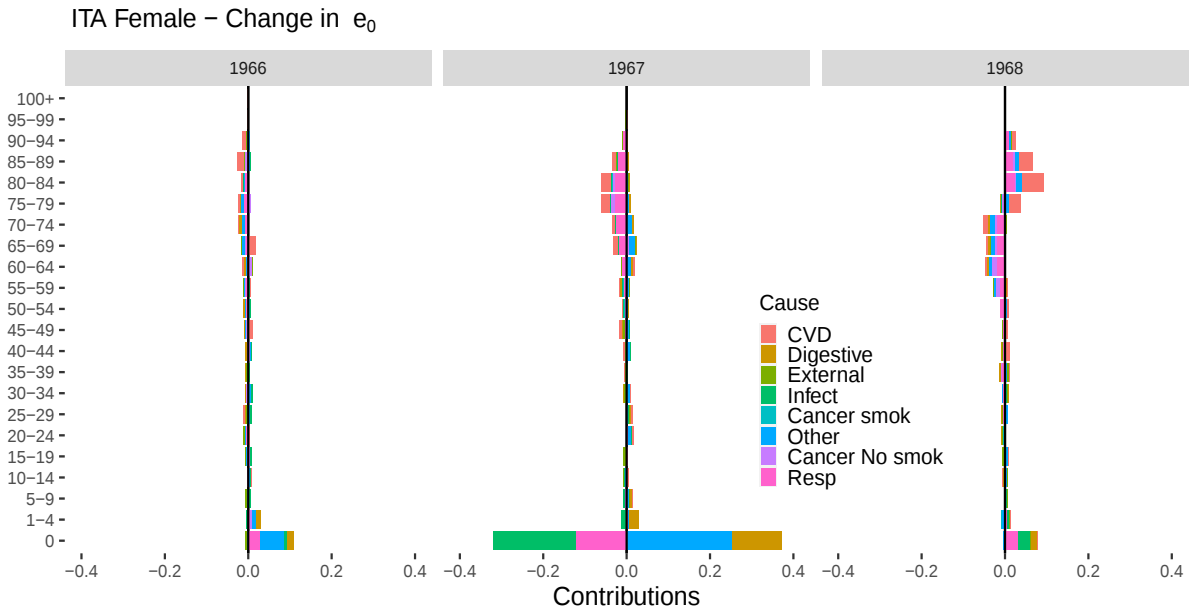


Figure A.3: Yearly contributions to changes in life expectancy for the years 1966–1968, Italian females.

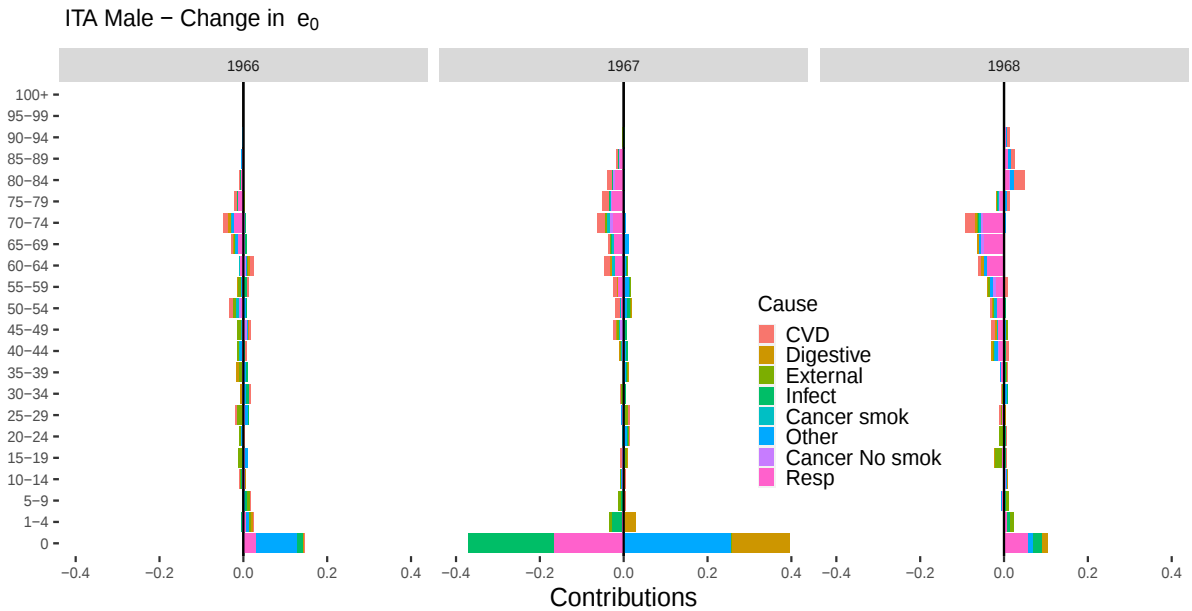


Figure A.4: Yearly contributions to changes in life expectancy for the years 1966–1968, Italian males.
