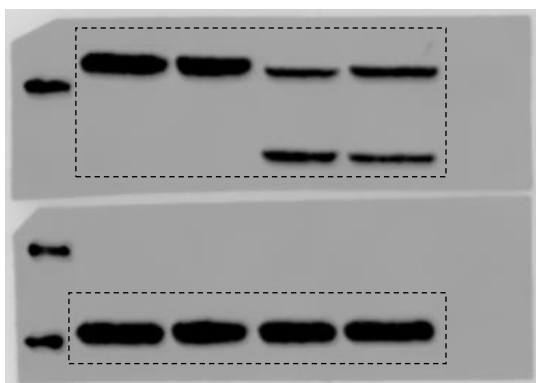
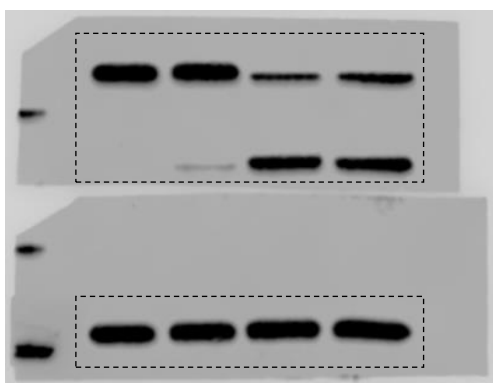
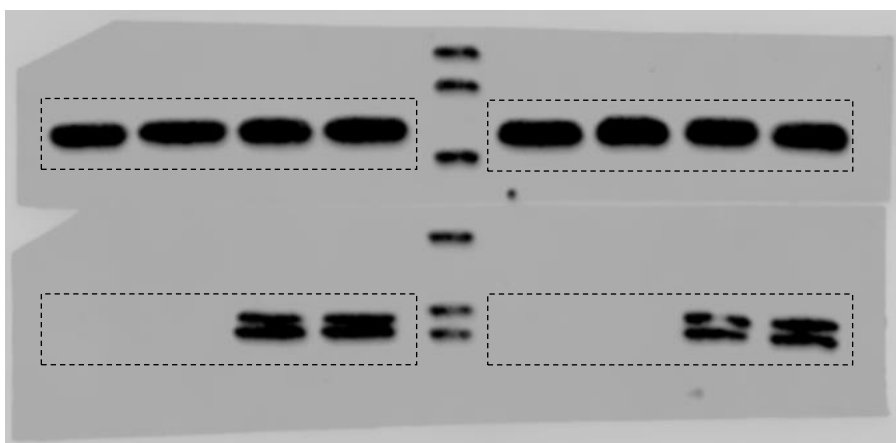




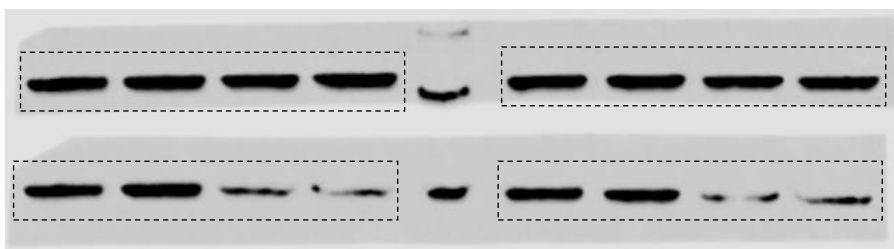
Uncropped Figure 4. (A) Effect of C4 and C5 on Cleaved-PARP in HCT116 cells.



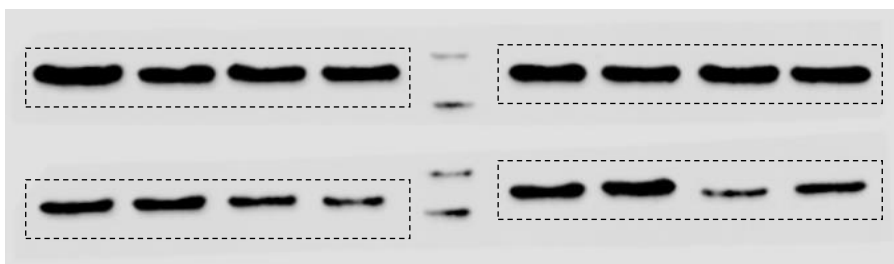
Uncropped Figure 4. (B) Effect of C4 and C5 on Cleaved-PARP in HT29 cells



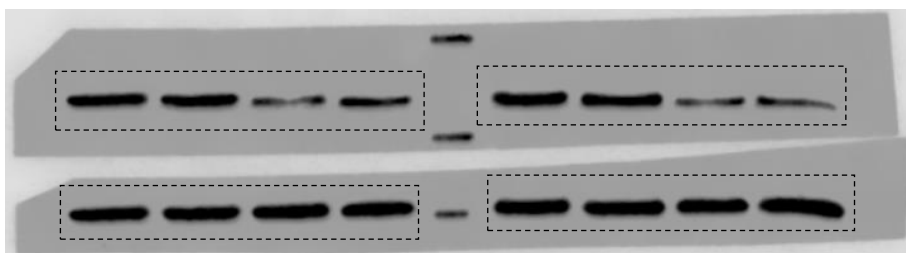
Uncropped Figure 4. (C-D) Effect of C4 and C5 on Caspase-3 levels in HCT116 and HT29 cells.



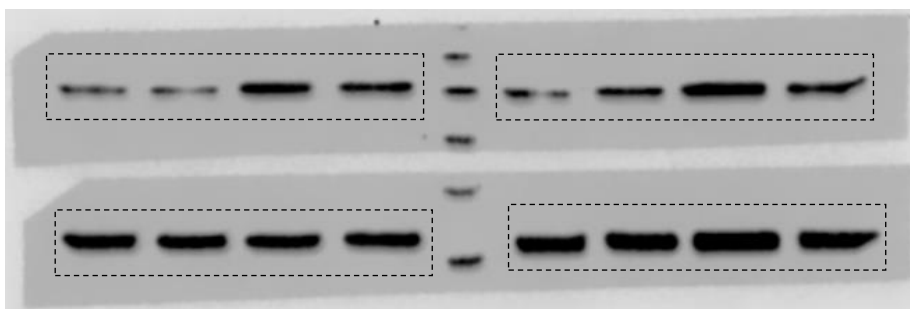

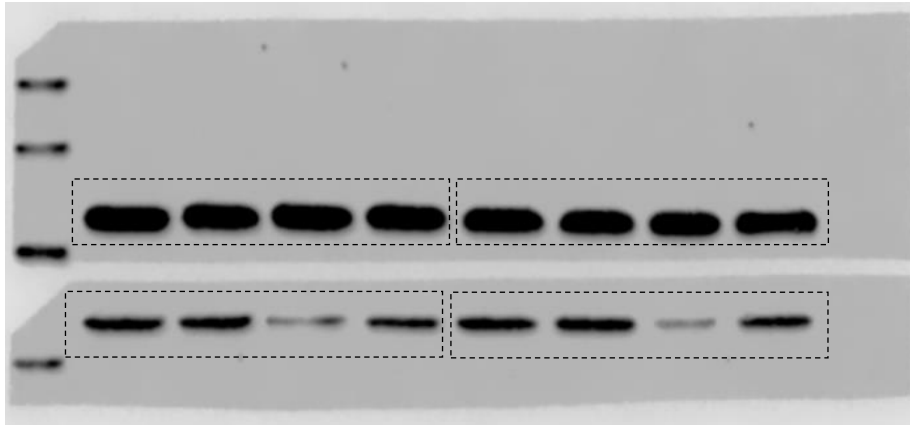
Uncropped Figure 9. (C-D) Effect of C4 and C5 compounds on Slug in HCT116 and HT29 colon cancer cell lines.



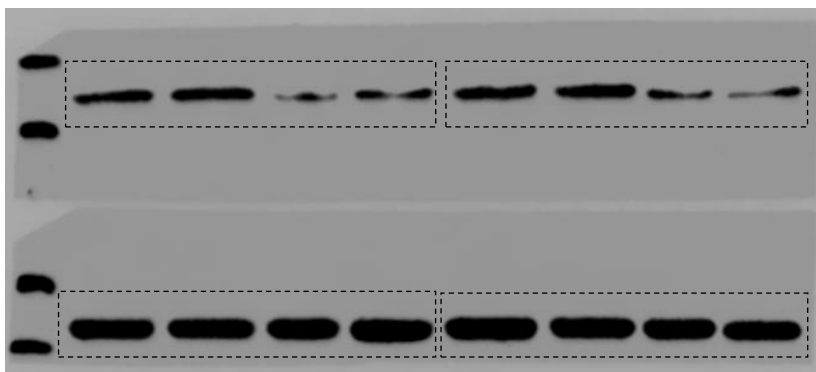
Uncropped Figure 9. (E-F) Effect of C4 and C5 compounds on Vimentin in HCT116 and HT29 colon cancer cell lines.



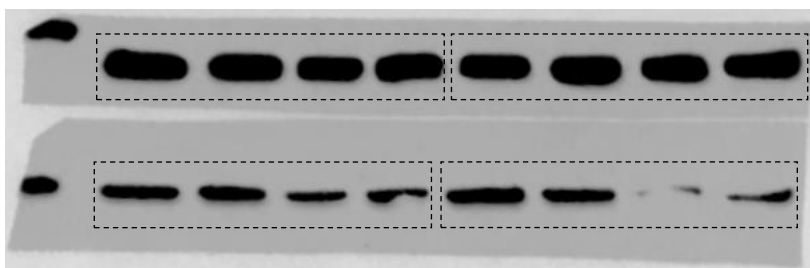
Uncropped Figure 9. (G-H) Effect of C4 and C5 compounds on E-Cadherin in HCT116 and HT29 colon cancer cell lines.
