

Supplementary Figure S2. Characteristics of adult dogs evaluated for BCS.

(A) Male with a brown oval-shaped marking elongated dorsoventrally on the caudal side of the scapulae; ears are brown and erect; tail curled; medial canthi black. (B) Male with a gray body and white coloration on the tail and distal limbs; tail straight and slender; ears erect. (C) Male with white distal limbs and a light brown body; tail curved upward at the tip; ears erect and small. (D) Male with a brown abdomen, white distal limbs and tail tip, and a black face; ears drooping; tail curled. (E) Male with brown coloration restricted to the face and a white body; ears erect; tail raised. (F) Male with an entirely gray body; tail slightly short; ears erect and tail raised. (G) Male, slightly small in size, with a black Shiba Inu-like coat pattern. (H) Male with white coloration distal to the elbows, on the distal hindlimbs, and on the ventral side extending from the neck to the abdomen; a white patch present on the dorsal neck; remaining body brown; tail curled; ears erect and black. (J) Male with an entirely white body. (K) Female with a black Shiba Inu-like coat pattern. (L) Female with slightly long hair and a light brown body; tail curled; ears folded. (M) Female with white distal limbs and ventral coloration extending from the neck to the abdomen, while the remainder of the body is black; ears folded. Accompanied by a brown puppy (white arrow). (N) Female with a light black face and ears and a pale brown body; mammary glands black; showing lameness. (P) Female with a Beagle-like coat pattern, although the color boundaries are indistinct; ears folded. (Q) Female with an entirely white body; tail curled; ears erect. Accompanied by two black and brown puppies (white arrows).
