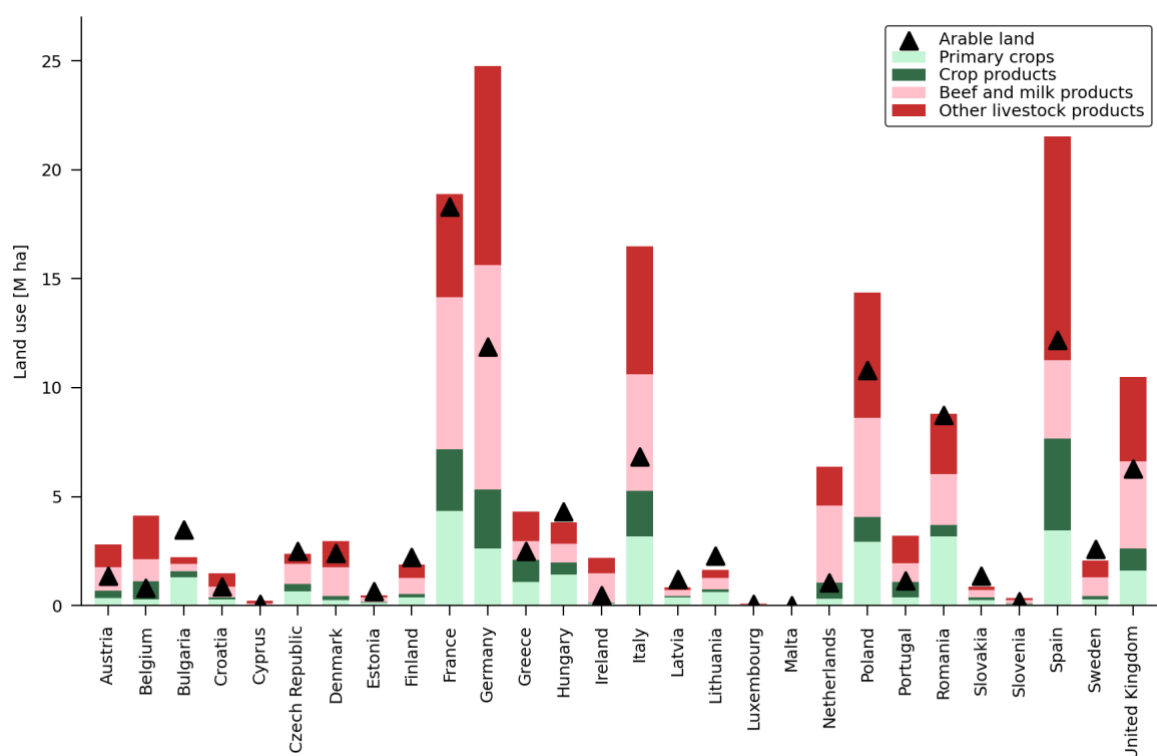


Fig. 1. Arable land (triangles; World Bank, 2013) and embodied land use in consumption of different agricultural products (bars) based on land use extension of FABIO (Bruckner et al., 2019)

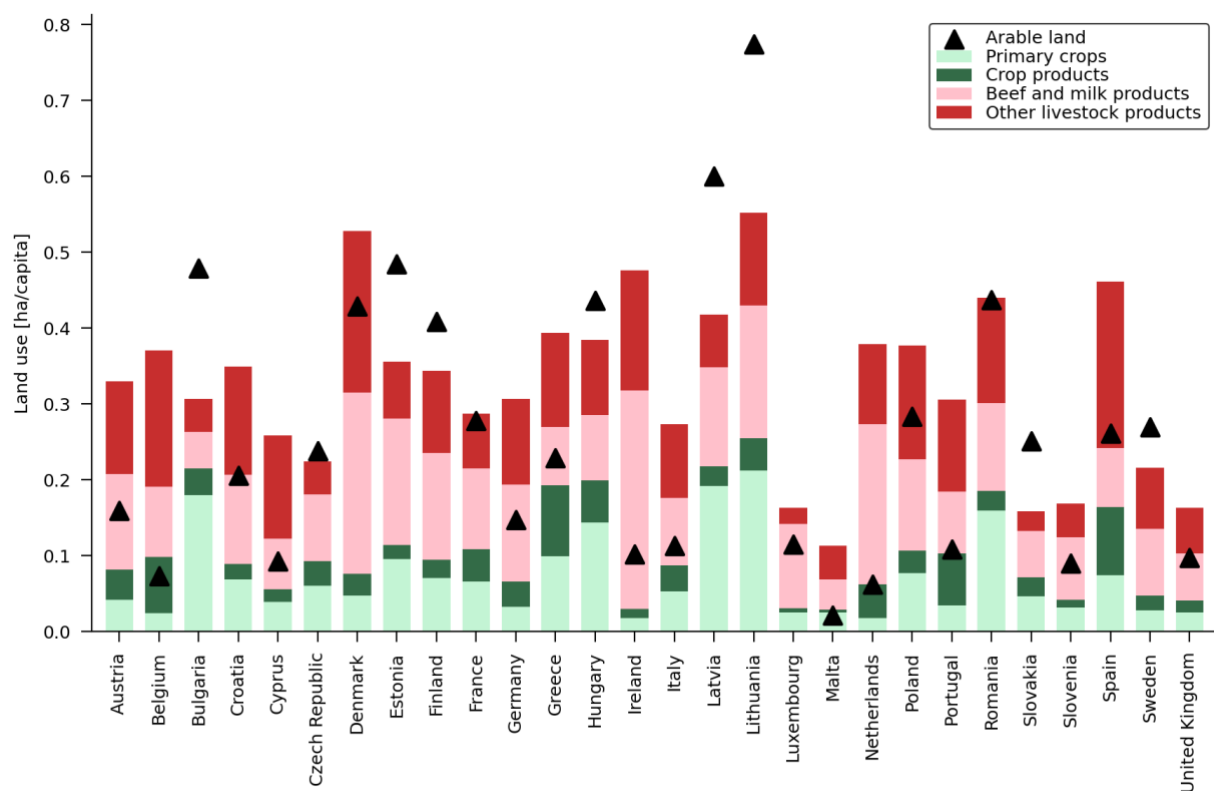


Fig. 2. Per capita arable land (stars; World Bank, 2013) and embodied land use in consumption of different agricultural products (bars) based on land use extension of FABIO (Bruckner et al., 2019)

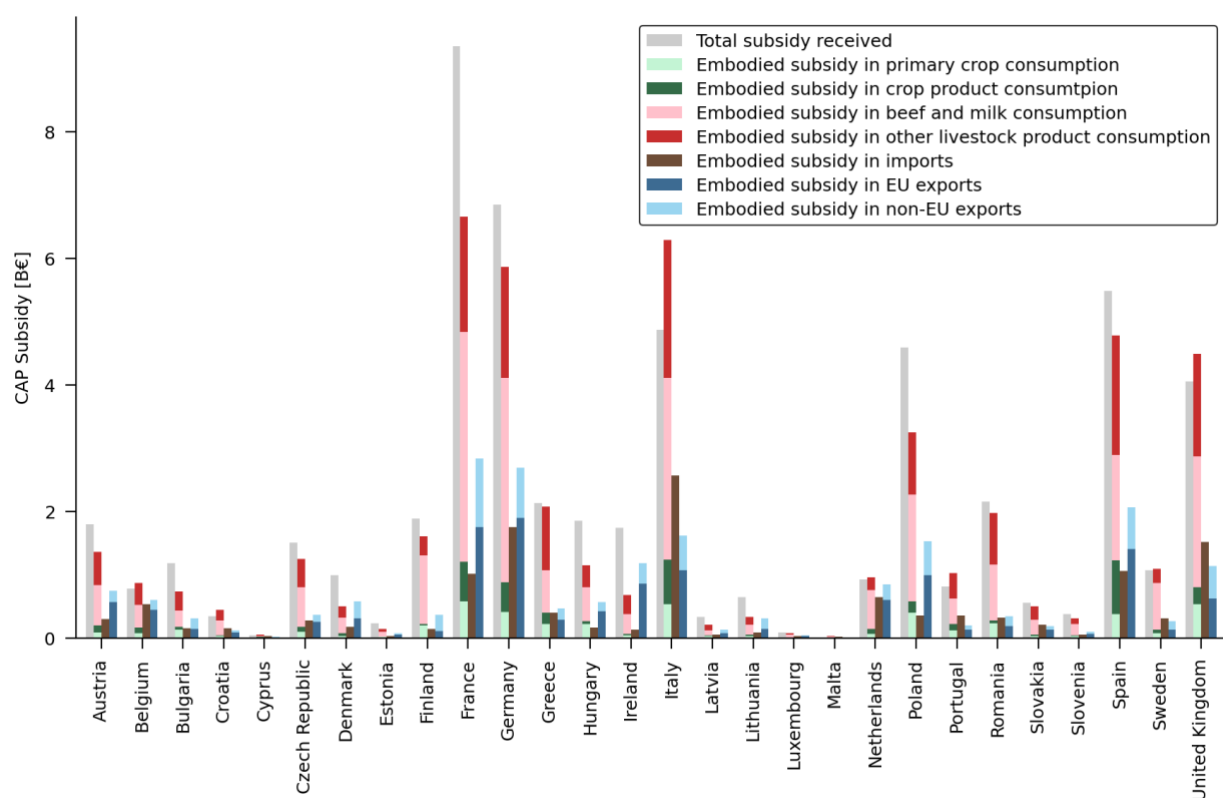


Fig. 3. Each bar shows (from left to right): (1) total CAP subsidies received, (2) embodied subsidy in consumption of primary crops, crop products, beef and milk products, and other livestock products, (4) subsidies imported from other EU countries, and (4) subsidies exported to EU and non-EU countries

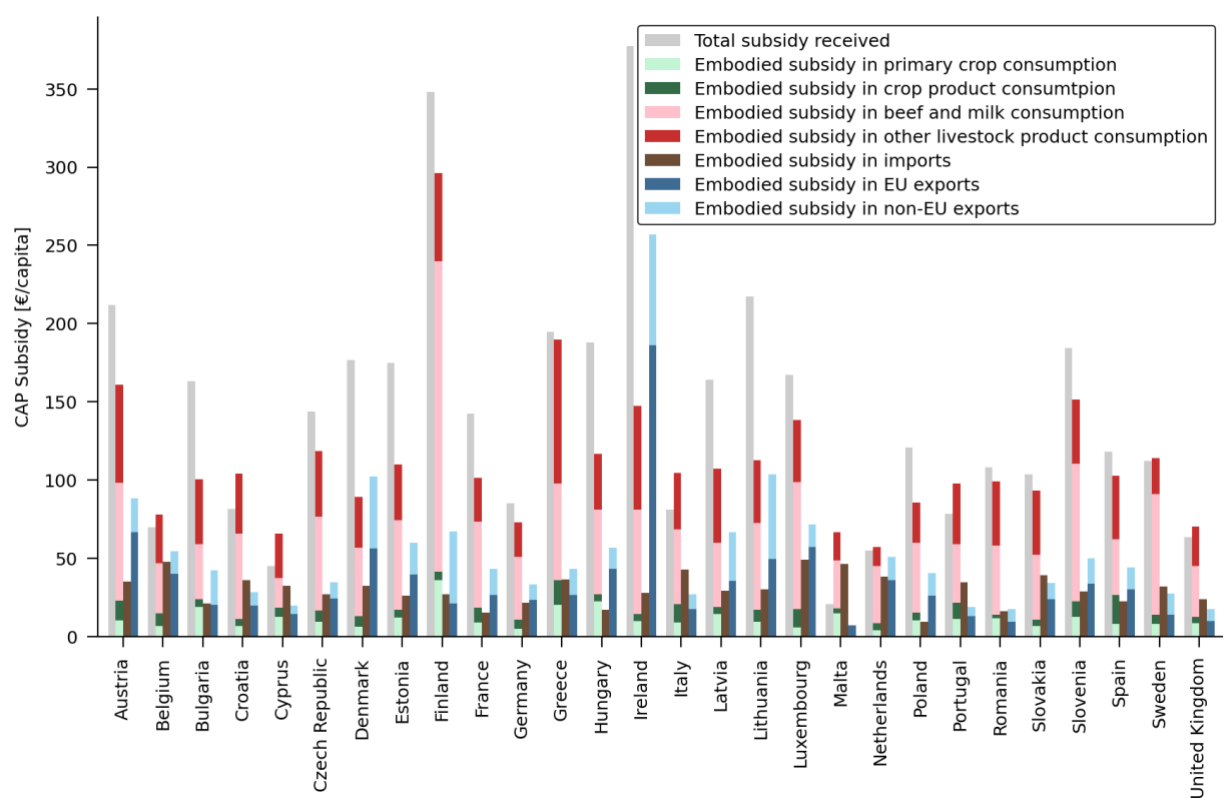


Fig. 4. Each bar shows (from left to right) the per capita: (1) total CAP subsidies received, (2) embodied subsidy in consumption of primary crops, crop products, beef and milk products, and other livestock products, (4) subsidies imported from other EU countries, and (4) subsidies exported to EU and non-EU countries

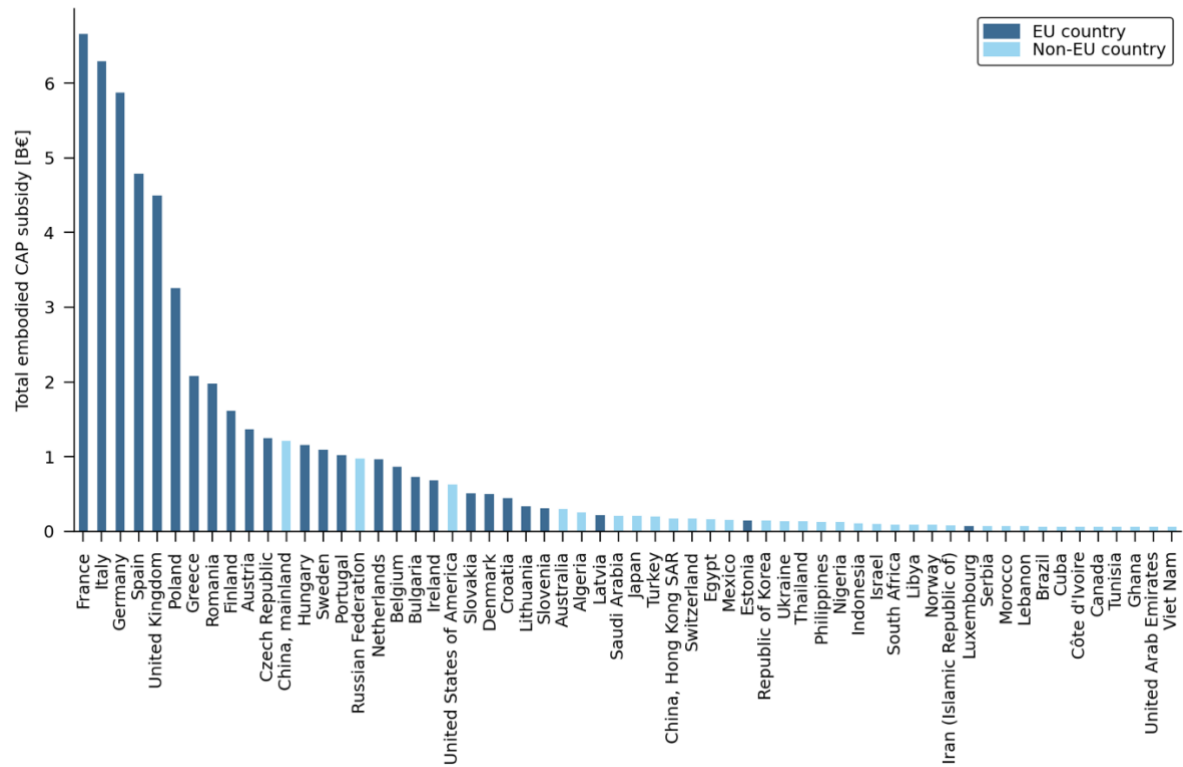


Fig. 5. Top 60 countries in total embodied CAP subsidy consumption

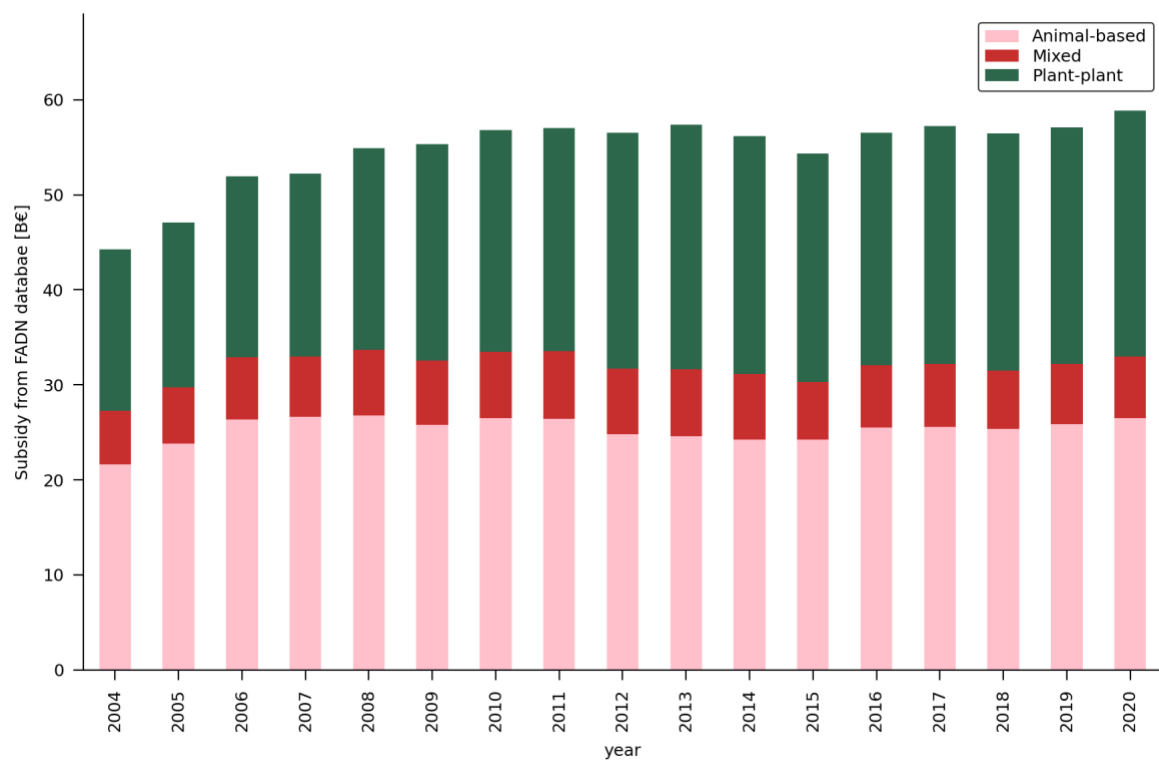


Fig. 6. CAP budget recorded in the FADN database over time (European Commission, 2022)
