Data collection	All cohort collections were approved by the ethical committee of the respective hospitals, including Beijing Centers for Diseases Control and Prevention (CDC), Centers for Preventive Medical Research, Staff Hospital of Jidong oil-field of China National Petroleum Corporation, and Kailuan Majiagou Hospital. Recruitment for all cohorts was conducted through voluntary advertisement, with participants required to be in a non-emergency state, self-reporting as healthy, and without major chronic diseases.
