Fig. 1a Kaplan-Meier curve for home death

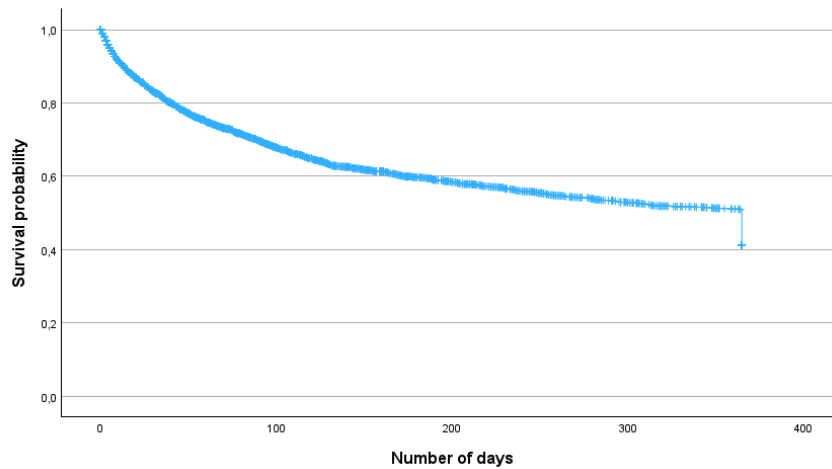


Fig. 1b Respite care

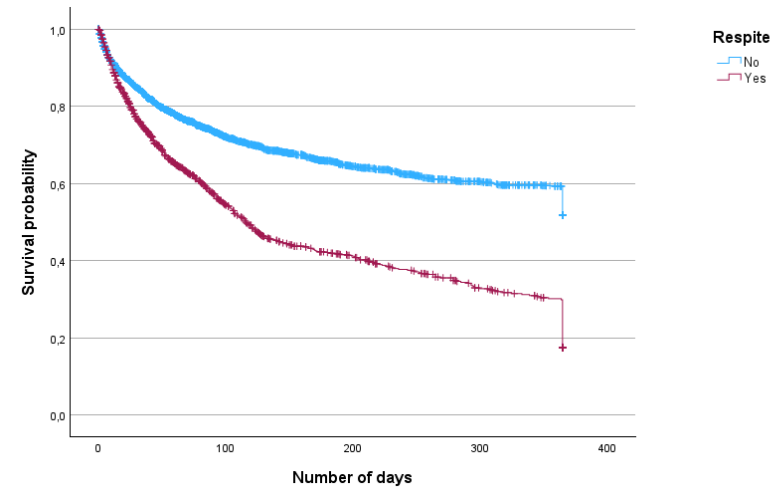


Fig. 1c Sex

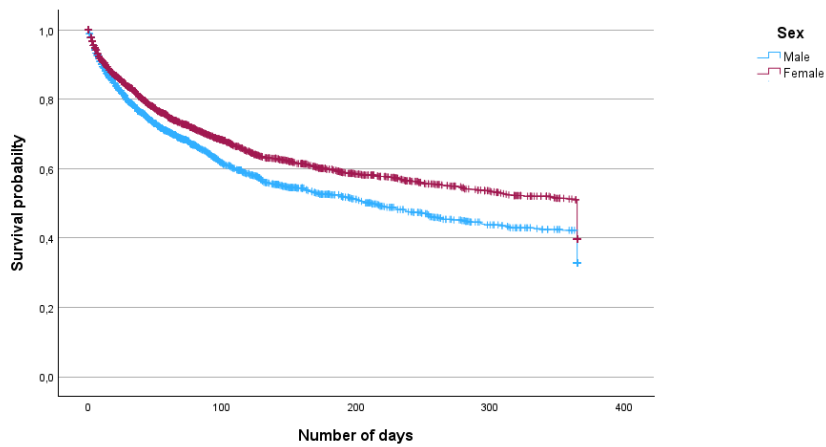


Fig. 1d Living alone

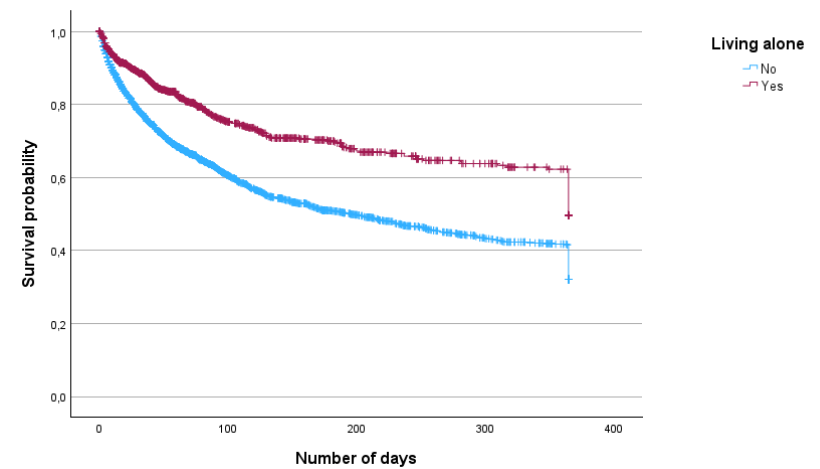


Fig. 1e Psychological care

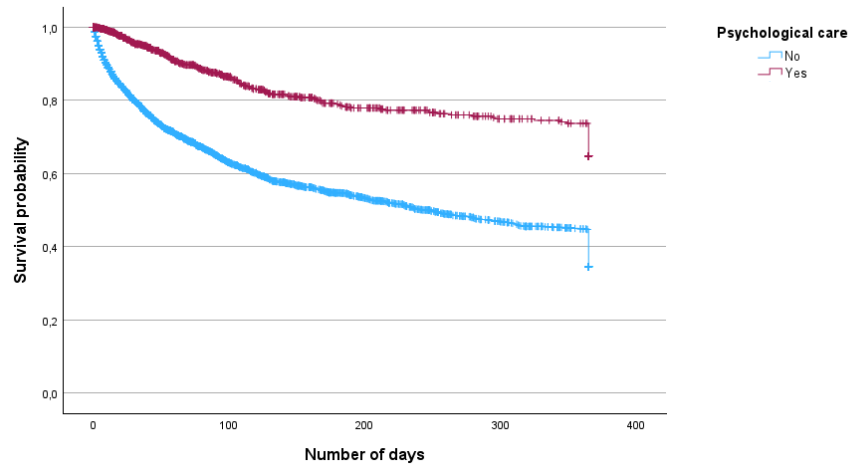


Fig. 1f Volunteer support and transportation

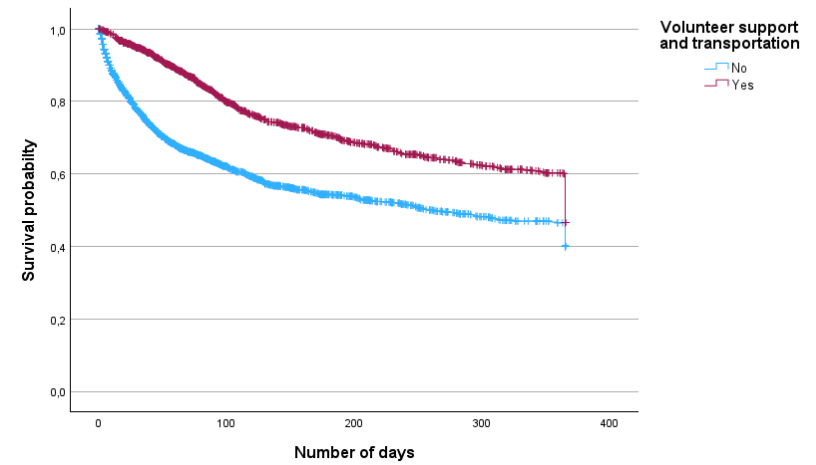
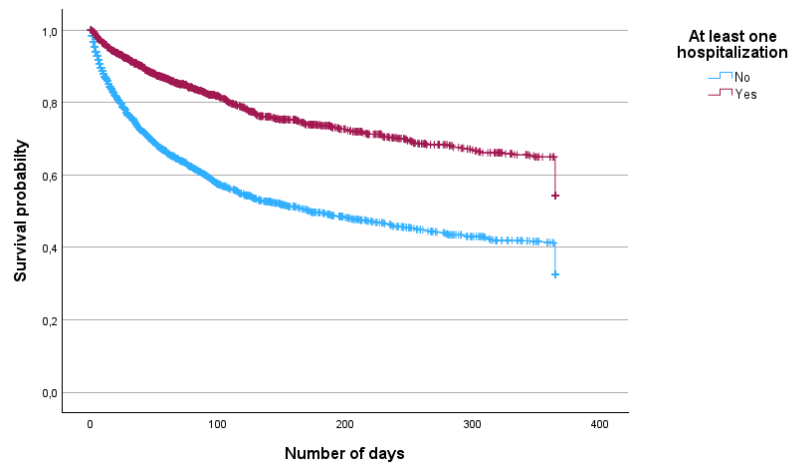


Fig. 1g At least one hospitalization
