In the Kenyan education system when the study participants entered, primary school was class 1 to 8 for aged 6 to 13 and secondary school was form1 to form4 for aged 14 to 17. Basically, class7: 12 years old, class8: 13 years old, Form1: 14 years old, Form2: 15 years old, Form3: 16 years old, and Form4: 17 years old, but not necessarily at those ages due to repeating classes, lack of funding, etc.
